Educational Access Scheme

EAS assists students whose education during Year 11 and 12 has been disadvantaged and who consequently may not gain entry into their preferred course. To be eligible for consideration, your educational performance must have been seriously affected for an extended period, usually at least six months. See careers or download a form from UAC.

Equity Scholarships

Equity Scholarships help financially disadvantaged students with the cost of tertiary study. By submitting one ES application through UAC, you will be considered for all available scholarships for which you will be eligible at participating institutions. Download an application or see careers.

Interested in Beauty? Are you in Year 12? The Australasian Beauty Therapy Academy would like to inform you of some exciting incentives that are available for students completing school this year and wishing to enrol to study the Diploma of Beauty Therapy.

Skills ACT is offering the full tuition costs for all students commencing a traineeship in the Diploma of Beauty Therapy, in an ACT salon. Students must gain employment at a salon located in ACT, with full or part time and register with apprenticeship support Australia, then enrol at the ABTA to study the Diploma of Beauty Therapy prior to December 31 2017.

ABTA intend to start classes from Monday 4th Dec. 2017, with some subjects like Spray Tan, Ear piercing, lash extension, then re-commence the study in mid Feb. 2017, duration is 1 year. Students will be required to attend class each Monday 9:30am – 2:30pm. This will be dependent on if the student is working full or part time. Enrolment is open now.

Volunteer tutors and students required for migrant and refugees Program for after school studies.

We would love to recruit both volunteer tutors and refugee students in need of support.

Here at MARSS, the Program for After School Studies (PASS) involves being matched with a student from a migrant or refugee background between the ages of 8-25, and helping them with their studies. This program runs out of our Civic office on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays between 3:30pm-6:30pm and we expect our volunteers to commit to a minimum of one hour within those program times. Volunteers can be both students and staff.

We also run outreach programs at Tuggeranong Library commencing this year (Wednesday 4:00pm-5:30pm). These locations are strictly for the ages of 8 – 15.

We are also interested in reaching out to as many migrant and refugee students as possible, to ensure sustainable settlement in the ACT in a caring and supportive way.
